Congratulations and "hats off" to our public works' department and superintendent, Tyler Shuster, for a great job of snow removal this winter.

They also just recently handled a serious water main break which was made much worse because of a broken valve, nearby, and several others that were not in working condition. As a result of this situation, practically the whole town was without water for a couple hours. Because of the low water flow, a "boiling alert" was announced on T.V., in the schools, and by phone to those who signed up for the mass emergency notification through the EMA. We are planning a valve maintenance and or replacement program in the coming spring and summer.

You've probably noticed construction going on at East Main Street as the beginnings of our new Family Dollar store is starting.

Timber Trail subdivision will soon be breaking ground when the weather starts cooperating. This promises to be an exciting addition to our village.

We have been enforcing our dumpster enclosure ordinance and violations will be treated as a minor misdemeanor for non-compliance. This, of course, is for maintenance of our business and industrial properties. Most of these have already complied with a 3-sided enclosure, which is required.

Income Tax Filing Help:

A representative from the St. Mary's tax office will be in the Town Hall on April 8th from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm to assist residents in filing their Village income taxes.

Change batteries in Smoke Detectors and Carbon Monoxide Detectors.

On March 8th we start daylight savings time. Don't forget to change the batteries in your smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors. The fire department has units available for those financially unable to purchase one. We can also come to your home and replace batteries and replace detectors (if needed) for those that need assistance in doing so. Ask any fire department member about this program. SHELBY COUNTY EMERGENCY MASS EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION!

On 11-9-11, The **Shelby County Emergency Mass Notification System** was launched. It is capable of reaching landlines, cellular, Blackberries/PDAs, pagers and TTY/TTD devices for the hearing impaired. The primary use of the system will be to disseminate messages pertaining to the health, safety or welfare of the public when affected by a perceived, emerging, or imminent emergency event.

The **Shelby County Emergency Mass Notification System** will be used for severe weather warnings, water contamination/boil advisories, evacuations, shelter in place, missing children or endangered adults, violent criminal suspect searches, etc. This system separate of any established automated notification system and will not be used for delays or closings of a non-emergency manner.



If the system is activated, it will identify itself and indicate what the message is regarding, please listen carefully. If you receive notification, the emergency is in your area. The system is very advanced and "targeted areas" are very specific.

FROM THE DESK OF THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR

The sun will come out tomorrow, bet your bottom dollar. I sure hope so! We've had a lot of ice this year and it's been difficult trying to prevent the roads and sidewalks from becoming skating rinks. The guys plowing have done a great job. This winter we've had to leave some snow on the roads because of all the ice underneath. The snow at least allows for traction.

New street signs for Main and Pike are scheduled to be installed this spring. The lettering will be larger and so will the signs. This is being done per ODOT requirement.

Our major street construction project for 2015 will be Young Street. The Village has received funding through a grant and a 0% interest loan. This year Phase 1 will be done. It will entail new water, sewer and storm sewer lines down the entire length of Young Street. From Second Street to Third Street, new curbs, gutters, sidewalks and pavement will be constructed. Our next grant application will be to try for funds to complete the rest of the concrete and asphalt work from Third Street to Pike.
